Message from the Special Administrator

In my last community notice circulated on 18 November 2025, I advised that the Inspector appointed by the Court to investigate the administration of the Adnyamathanha Master Trust had informed the Court that the delivery of his final report would be delayed, and that there would be a directions hearing on 25 November 2025 for the purposes of making further orders regarding the Inspector's reports.

The Inspector produced an interim report to the Court on 20 November 2025. At the hearing on 25 November 2025, ATLA sought the Court's permission to distribute the Inspector's interim report to common law holders. Rangelea asked the Court not to make any orders regarding distribution of the Inspector's reports until after the final report had been provided. Rangelea also said the reports might contain confidential or private information that should not be shared among the community.


The Court said that it does want the interim report to be shared with the community but will give the parties an opportunity to review it first and to raise any matters of confidential or private information (for example, bank account details or personal addresses) that should be excluded from what is shared more widely. The Court has set a further hearing on 10 December 2025 to address those matters, after which we expect that the Inspector's interim report can be shared with common law holders.

A further date was set by the Court for delivery of the inspector's final report, on 20 February 2026. The Inspector can seek further time from the court if he is unable to complete his investigation of the Master Trust and all of the sub-groups, and write his final report in that time.

I will provide a further update following the next hearing on 10 December 2025.

Compensation money (85%) will remain with the SA Supreme Court until the investigation by the Inspector is completed.
