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Message from the Special Administrator

Dear Common Law Holders

In my last community notice, circulated on 10 June 2026, I provided an update that on 5 June 2026, Justice McIntyre ordered the parties to discuss if any parts of the Inspector's Third Interim Report (concerning the Master Trust) were confidential or private to individuals and needed to be blacked out before the report is published to Common Law Holders. I am writing to provide an update on the Court proceedings concerning the Inspector's reports.

The next Court hearing will be on **Wednesday 12 August 2026 at 2:15 pm**. ATLA had hoped the hearing could take place earlier, but this was the earliest date available.

The Inspector has now completed two important interim reports:

- the Third Interim Report, which deals with the Master Trust; and
- the Fourth Interim Report, which deals with the Sub-Groups. The Fourth Report was provided to the Court and the parties on 10 July 2026.

The Court needs to decide how much of these reports can be provided to Common Law Holders.

ATLA wants both reports to be made available to Common Law Holders, with only a small amount of sensitive personal information blacked out. ATLA has made submissions to the Court asking for this.

Rangelea and the Sub-Groups have said they want more information from the Third Interim Report kept confidential, including Rangelea board minutes. However, they did not file submissions with the Court by the due date, so we do not yet know exactly what they will ask the Court to do at the hearing.

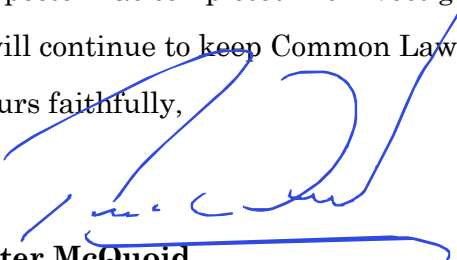
I will provide Common Law Holders with another update after the hearing on 12 August.

The Inspector has also advised that he intends to prepare a **Final Report** bringing together the findings from his Third and Fourth Interim Reports. The Final Report will be written in a way that is clear and easy to understand. There is not yet a date for when it will be completed.

Finally, I remind Common Law Holders that **85% of the compensation money remains under the control of the Supreme Court of South Australia**. It will remain there until the Inspector has completed his investigation and the Court makes further orders.

I will continue to keep Common Law Holders informed of important developments.
